



Glossary

Commonly used cosmetic terms you may hear while at our office:

American Academy of Facial Plastic Surgeons: Established in 1931, it is the largest plastic surgery specialty organization in the world

Blepharoplasty: surgical repair of droopy eyelids

Botox: Botulinum Toxin Type A, used to treat wrinkles in the forehead and eye region

CC: cubic centimeters, a common measurement for Botox/ Dysport.

Crows feet: wrinkles that are found surrounding the outside of the eyes

“Filler”: Restylane, Radiesse, and Juvederm are examples. Fillers are used to treat crow’s feet, laugh or smile lines and facial creases

FDA: Food and Drug Administration. Regulates and approves drugs and products that can be sold to consumers

Glabellar Lines: the dynamic wrinkles between the brows

Juvederm: An FDA approved wrinkle filler used to correct wrinkles, lift facial contours and enhance lips, made by the makers of Botox

Otolaryngology: the branch of medicine that diagnoses and treats diseases of the ears, neck, nose and throat

Otoplasty: is the cosmetic surgery of the ears, typically pinning them back

Neurotoxin: a purified protein that is noxious to the nerves.

Preceptorship Day: these are once a month training days, always on a Friday. Dr. Dayan trains fellow physicians on injectibles and laser treatment. Patients still receive care from Dr. Dayan, but receive a discounted price.

Radiesse: a non-surgical treatment that is used to enhance or augment the lips and fill in the naso-labial folds

Restylane: cosmetic dermal filler used for the treatment of facial wrinkles and folds

Rhinoplasty: the technical term for a nose job

Units: a quantity of measurement.
